ASK YOUR VET - SPAY/NEUTER SUBSIDY PROGRAM (NEW YORK CITY)

For individual trappers, rescuers and caretakers in New York City, Neighborhood Cats will subsidize the cost for spay/neuter surgery by your own veterinarian or another private veterinary clinic. You don't have to buy your own equipment; you can borrow from the trap banks listed below. Please give yourself at least one week to secure equipment. All traps available from the sources below have a removable rear door. Use only these traps to facilitate caring for cats pre/post-surgery. Get two dividers when you borrow traps. Please reserve one or two more traps than there are cats. Before you leave a trap bank, make sure you know how to use traps and that they are all in working order. All trap banks require a refundable deposit. All equipment must be returned clean and in working order before the deposit is returned.

If you are managing a colony of cats in New York City and doing TNR, you can help your cats and all community cats by registering your colony in the Cat Stats NYC database, a program of Neighborhood Cats. By registering, you'll supply us with valuable information on the impact of TNR in NYC and help us gain more resources for feral and stray cats. You'll also make it easier for us to locate you if one of your eartipped cats arrives at the city shelter, Animal Care Centers of New York City (ACC). You can register more than one colony and update your colony information whenever you like. If you are trapping for uncertified feeders, make sure you register their colonies too! Otherwise, we'll have no idea these managed colonies exist. All information on your identity and the exact locations of colonies will be held in strict confidence.

EARTIPPED CATS & ANIMAL CARE CENTERS OF NYC

Over two decades ago, Neighborhood Cats spearheaded a program to retrieve eartipped cats from the three shelters operated by Animal Care Centers of NYC (ACC). The program allows the cats to return to their colonies and go on with their outdoor lives. When an eartipped cat enters the shelter, we check our Cat Stats database and attempt to locate and notify the original caretaker so they can claim the cat.

We now have the help of ACC to help get the word out about eartipped cats at their facilities. To receive alerts and any updates, follow ACC's Instagram account: @nycacc eartipalert.

With more TNR, there may be more eartipped cats entering the shelters. Here are some important steps that you as caretakers can take to help us find you and get your eartipped colony cat back to you ASAP:

- Make sure your contact info is current and you are receiving our Neighborhood Cats emails.
- Register and update your colonies in our database, www.catstats.org/nyc
- If you are trapping for uncertified feeders, make sure you register their colonies too. Otherwise, we'll
 have no idea these managed colonies exist.
- Do your due diligence when it comes to community relations. Learn which neighbors are unhappy with the cats and why, then make good faith efforts to resolve the situation.



IHA'S QUICK GUIDE TO: COMMUNITY CATS





It could save a cat's life!

The ear-tip signifies that the "community cat" has been spayed or neutered, has received a rables vaccine, and is part of the Trap, Neuter, Return (TNR) movement. An ear-tip is intended for cats that live primarily outdoors. These community cats may not have an owner or home. Their "home" usually consists of a couple of safe places to protect themselves from the harsh elements and compassionate citizens that feeds them.

These ear-tipped community cats should never be re-trapped and brought to a shelter unless they are sick. instead, they should be left in the neighborhood to prevent other cats from moving in. Even if you don't like cats, these TNR ear-tipped, spayed/neutered cats play an important role in keeping the cat population under control.

An ear-tip is the removal of the distal 1/4 or tip of the cat's left ear. The tip removed is approximately 3/8 of an inch or 1 cm on an adult cat and proportionally smaller on a kitten. The procedure is performed under sterile conditions while the cat is under anesthesia. There is little or no bleeding and it is relatively painless.

An ear-tip has proven to be the safest and the most effective method to visually identify a community cat: that has been spayed or neutered. It has become universally accepted and is recognized by international animal welfare organizations.





DOES D.C. SUPPORT TNR? YES!

1929

SEC. 8. That hereafter the poundmaster shall seize all cats found running at large and convey the same to the pound, or other place to be designated by the commissioners, and there destroyed. Any citizen may deliver any such animal to the poundmaster, who shall destroy the same as above required.

- 2010 § 8-1802. Animal Care and Control Agency
 - (c) The Animal Care and Control Agency shall promote:
- (2) The utilization of trap, spay or neuter, and return practices as a means of controlling the feral cat population; provided, that all efforts shall be made to adopt out a trapped, tamable kitten.








TNR LOCATIONS SINCE 2012






